Submission deadline: Titles and abstracts must **reach** the Program Chair by **October 17, 2011** in order to be considered. Paper and poster submissions will be reviewed by a committee of the Institute's Directors, officers, and a Program Consultant. Notification of acceptance or rejection will be sent by November 7, 2011.

Registration fee: \$40.00 (students \$10.00) until January 1, 2012; thereafter, including at the meeting, \$60.00 (students \$20.00). **Registration fees are submitted separately from papers.** Registration fees apply to all attendees, including paper and poster presenters. Participants need not be members of the Institute, and students are welcome. - Berkeley City Club <http://berkeleyhistorichotel.com> , 2315 Durant Avenue, Berkeley, CA 94704, (510) 848-7800, Fax: (510) 848-5900 (on Durant a block below Telegraph). Amazing Julia Morgan “castle” with spectacular indoor pool under broad pointed arches. Close to Wurster Hall. \$154- \$156 / night.
- The Faculty Club (formerly Berkeley Men’s Faculty Club) <http://www.berkeleyfacultyclub.com/hotel> , on campus, a block from Wurster Hall, (510) 540-5678. Classic natural wood paneled Maybeck Craftsman building. Neither club membership nor UC affiliation is required. \$80- \$260 / night.
- The Shattuck Plaza Hotel <http://www.hotelshattuckplaza.com> , 2086 Allston Way, Berkeley, CA 94704, (866) 466-9199 or (510) 845-7300. Recently renovated 1910 hotel, Berkeley’s first and oldest. Close to BART, several blocks to Wurster Hall. \$155- \$205 / night.
- Downtown Berkeley Inn <http://www.downtownberkeleyinn.com> , 2001 Bancroft Way, Berkeley, CA 94704, (510) 843-4043 Fax: (510) 843-4046 (on Bancroft and Milvia, one block below Shattuck). Contemporary building, parking included. Easy uphill walk or bus to Wurster Hall. \$89- \$99 / night.
- The Beau Sky Hotel <http://www.beausky.com> , 2520 Durant Ave., Berkeley, CA 94704, (800) 990-2328 or (510) 540-7688. Just down the street from the Durant, a short walk to Wurster Hall. \$119- \$169 / night.

Parking: Parking near the central campus may be scarce on Friday. On Saturday, many central University parking lots probably will be available to the public. The public parking lots closest to Wurster Hall are privately owned and fill up early in the day. They are:

- The Bancroft Hotel Parking Lot, 2680 Bancroft Way, just west of the hotel
- Douglas Parking, 2304 Bowditch, just off Bancroft Way
- Bancroft Center Parking, 2558 Bancroft Way
- Sather Gate Parking, 2450 Durant Avenue, ½ block west of Telegraph Avenue

Daily rates at these lots range from \$12 to \$24. Rates are subject to change. Watch for signboard notices of temporary lot restrictions for special events. Fines can be high. Allow plenty of time to find parking.

Alternatives to parking: Consider coming to campus by public transportation <http://511.org> , including BART <http://www.bart.gov> (Bay Area Rapid Transit) and AC Transit buses <http://www.actransit.org> , or by taxi.

Museum: The Phoebe Apperson Hearst Museum of Anthropology, <http://hearstmuseum.berkeley.edu> , is located in Kroeber Hall. The exhibition hall is open Wednesdays through Saturdays 10:00-4:30, and Sundays 12:00-4:00. Admission is free. The current exhibitions are *From the Maker's Hand: Selections from the Permanent Collections (Africa, Southwestern US, Ancient Mediterranean, Egypt, and Peru)* and *Native California Cultures*. The collections storage area is open for research on weekdays only.
