Registration fee: \$35.00 (students \$10.00) until December 1, 2008; thereafter \$50.00 (students \$15.00). **Please note that registration fees must be submitted separately from papers.** Participants need not be members of the Institute; students are welcomed. Those who need a formal letter of invitation to solicit travel funds from their institution should request it along with their registration.

Papers: Only 21 papers will be accepted. Topics are confined to Andean archaeology or closely related subjects. To submit a paper, please send title, a 100 word (maximum) abstract, an estimate of time required for presentation (maximum 30 minutes, including discussion), and type(s) of projection equipment needed.

Paper deadlines: Titles and abstracts must **reach** the Program Chair by **October 18, 2008**, in order to be considered. All papers will be reviewed by a committee consisting of the Institute's Directors, and a Program Consultant. Notification of acceptance or rejection will be sent by November 8, 2008.

Program: Registration at the meeting will begin at 8:30 a.m. on both Friday and Saturday mornings, and programs and nametags for pre-registrants may be picked up at that time. The program will begin promptly at 9:15 am. There are scheduled activities on both Friday and Saturday evenings. If you want a copy of the program, please send a self-addressed envelope. Locations: For the location of Wurster Hall, hotels, etc., please check the University of California, Berkeley web page (<http://www.berkeley.edu>) or request information when you send in your pre-registration (please enclose a self-addressed envelope).

Housing: We have made arrangements with two hotels close to Wurster Hall for special meeting rates. **We strongly recommend that you make your reservations as soon as possible.** The Durant Hotel (www.hoteldurant.com), 2600 Durant Ave., Berkeley, CA 94704 has meeting rates of \$159 for a queen room and \$195 for a double double room. Overnight parking for hotel guests is subject to a current \$20.00 per vehicle, per night charge. Rates are subject to change without prior notice.

The Beau Sky Hotel, 2520 Durant Ave., Berkeley, CA 94704 (<http://www.beausky.com>), has offered us both single and double rooms for \$119, including continental breakfast. Please note that this hotel is in a multi-story building and has no elevator. A block of rooms is being held there until December 1, 2008. Please note that all hotel bills are subject to a 12% city tax and that parking will cost extra. There is also a portage/luggage handling fee of \$2 in and \$2 out at the Durant Hotel. Other accommodations in Berkeley may be found on the web at: <http://www.berkeleycvb.com/accommodations.cfm>

Parking: On both days, participants will need to seek their own parking spaces in municipal, privately-owned or University of California lots available to the public. Please note that Central Campus Parking will probably not be available on Friday, January 9, 2009. On Saturday, January 10, 2009, many central University parking lots will probably be available to the public. Information about off-peak parking on campus is available at: <http://pt.berkeley.edu/park/public>. Spaces may be available in the Boalt Hall and the Kroeber/Bancroft Lots close to Wurster Hall. Tickets must be purchased from the yellow, ticket-dispensing machines at the entrances to the lots. Insert your money (preferably \$1 and/or \$5 bills) and press the **Green** button to obtain a ticket. Be sure to leave the ticket on your dashboard in plain sight. **Do not park** in "reserved" or restricted spaces; *pay attention to possible notices about special lot restrictions for the day. And, please give yourself extra time to park in case the closest lots are reserved!*

The closest public parking lots to Wurster Hall are privately owned and fill up early in the day. They are:

The Bancroft Hotel Parking Lot, 2680 Bancroft Way, just west of the hotel

Douglas Parking, 2304 Bowditch, just off Bancroft Way

Bancroft Center Parking, 2558 Bancroft Way

Sather Gate Parking, 2450 Durant Avenue, ½ block west of Telegraph Avenue Current Daily Rates at these lots range from \$ 12 - \$ 24. Please note they are subject to change.
